

BLOOD CLOT SYMPTOMS CHECKER

A blood clot that forms in the veins of a person's legs or arms, called a deep vein thrombosis (DVT), can grow or break off and travel to a person's lungs. A blood clot in a person's lung, called a pulmonary embolism (PE), is life-threatening.

SYMPTOMS

Pain

Swelling

Red, discolored

Warm to the touch

Seek medical attention as soon as possible.

SYMPTOMS

Chest pain

Difficulty breathing

Coughing, coughing up blood

Fast heart rate
